1. INTRODUCTION

1.1. THE COOK ISLANDS – THE HEART OF THE SOUTH PACIFIC

The Cook Islands is a natural pearl necklace of 15 islands with a total population of approximately 15,000, scattered over some two million square kilometres of the Pacific Ocean.

The Cook Islands sits in the centre of the Polynesian Triangle, just west of Tahiti and French Polynesia.

1.2. RAROTONGA

Discover the Cook Islands just as Captain Cook did...unspoilt, unhurried, unique.

The Cook Islands sits like a necklace of pearls atop the velvet blue ocean, and in the heart is the perfect pearl, the precious and peaceful capital island of Rarotonga. Rarotonga is encircled by white sandy beaches and shimmering turquoise lagoons and at its centre are majestic high mountains clothed in lush cloud forest.


The diverse Rarotonga landscape offers travellers a wide diversity of activities – the mountains offer a cross-island trek and 4WD safari tour, a drive along the island's back roads with plantations alongside give a glimpse into the life of the local people, the Resorts' secluded Aroa Beach offers exceptional relaxation and beauty, the Aroa Lagoon Marine Sanctuary in front of The Rarotongan Beach Resort & Lagoonarium and adjacent boutique sister resort, Sanctuary Rarotonga-on the beach, offers snorkelling, swimming, stand-up paddleboarding and kayaking and the deep Pacific Ocean beyond the encircling coral reef offers whale watching, scuba diving and game fishing.

Rarotonga has so much to offer with its combination of natural beauty, mouth-watering local cuisine, exciting tropical cocktails, lively culture, captivating traditional songs and dances, and spectacular wildlife. The pace here is supremely relaxed, the mood carefree, the culture vibrant, and the people the friendliest you'll meet anywhere. Sample all Rarotonga has to offer and remember you are on holiday, so relax, unwind, and enjoy!

The local people are Cook Island Maori with close ethnic affinity to the indigenous people of Tahiti (Maohi), New Zealand (Maori), and Hawaii (Kamaina). Most Cook Islanders are bilingual speaking both Cook Islands Maori and English. The people of the island of Pukapuka also speak their own distinctive language. The northern islands were settled around 800AD by migrants from the west - Samoa and Tonga. The southern group inhabitants are largely descended from voyagers from the Society Islands and the Marquesas. The total population of the Cook Islands is approximately 15,000, of whom around 10,000 live on Rarotonga, the business and economic hub, with 180,000 visitors each year.

The people of the Cook Islands are naturally friendly, easy-going, and sociable. They are also resourceful and hold pride in their cultural identity. The islanders are a generally conservative and religious people; however, the lifestyle is relaxed and informal. On the capital island of Rarotonga, the lifestyle is more varied, and the standard of living is higher than in the smaller, more remote, outer islands.

There are two main roads on Rarotonga. You can circle the island on the coastal Ara Tapu sealed road, past the beaches, town, and settlements, or you can take the older inland road, Te Ara o Toi, which winds through fields and village farm plots of taro, pawpaw, bananas, arrowroot, noni and coconut.



1.3.**THE RAROTONGAN BEACH RESORT & LAGOONARIUM**

The Rarotongan Beach Resort & Lagoonarium is the Cook Islands' iconic signature full-service family-friendly beach resort. 1.5. RESORT LOCATIONS

Set on Aroa Beach, Rarotonga's most beautiful white sandy beach on the shores of Aroa Lagoon (the Lagoon of Love), the Resorts are located on the island's sunshine southwest coast where guests can enjoy **all-day sun, stunning sunsets, all-tide safe swimming, and Rarotonga's best off-beach snorkelling** in the traditional marine sanctuary directly in front of the resort.

2. GUEST INFORMATION

2.1. ACTIVITIES

Our Activities Hut is located poolside and is open daily from 9am to 5pm. Our activities staff would be delighted to assist you with any equipment and information relating to the extensive resort activities programme. The Resort offers a wide range of exciting recreational, sporting, and cultural activities, many focused on the lagoon itself which is a marine sanctuary (ra'ui), declared by traditional leaders on 1 March 2000 for the conservation of marine life within the zone. Consequently, **all-tide snorkelling in Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary, a fish breeding area, is the very best on Rarotonga** with an amazing variety of fish to delight in swimming with.



Our Activities Staff are happy to assist with providing beach towels and equipment for Resort activities such as **snorkelling masks and flippers, reef shoes** (essential if you're exploring the magnificent marine sanctuary), **stand-up paddleboard paddles, kayak paddles, tennis balls & rackets, tennis court bookings, volleyballs, petanque and a wide variety of board games, plus extensive local knowledge.** We kindly request that you do not take any Resort equipment off the property, including beach towels and snorkelling gear. Please note all equipment borrowed is for a maximum of 4 hours' use and must be returned to the Activities Hut by 5pm on the same day. A fee of NZ\$20 per item is charged to your room for late

delivery, and cost price per item is charged for the non-return of any Activities equipment. Other beach and lagoon activities include **beach volleyball, beach soccer, kayaking, fish feeding and Night Snorkelling Tours.**

Additionally, The Rarotongan Beach Resort & Lagoonarium also offers Games Rooms which provides great facilities for entertaining all age groups. Features include big screen TVs, pool table, table tennis and giant chess playing area.

Due to the popularity of many activities, we recommend that you book in advance with the Activities Team, particularly the **Night Snorkelling Tour** (which is weather and tide dependent). For further information contact the Activities Hut, dial 5018, and talk to one of our friendly activities staff members.

ACTIVITIES SCHEDULE

Our Activities Schedule is advertised daily at the Activities Hut Blackboard and in the daily Guest Newsletter. Please be aware that some activities may be weather and/or tide dependent – your safety as our guest is our priority.

2.2. AIR CONDITIONING

All the Resort guestrooms, suites, bungalow, and villas offer **individual air conditioning** as well as a ceiling or wall fan for maximum guest comfort. To operate your air conditioning system, please follow these simple instructions:

1. To turn your air conditioning ON or OFF, take the remote control out of its holder on the wall, point it at the unit and press the top right button.
2. To ADJUST the TEMPERATURE, press the BLACK arrow buttons down to lower the temperature, or up to increase the temperature. To begin with **we suggest you set it at about 22 degrees Celsius.** To maintain a comfortable temperature after the room has cooled down, please **re-adjust it to about 25** degrees, and enjoy!
3. To ensure your air-conditioning unit works at its best please always **KEEP ALL WINDOWS & DOORS CLOSED** when operating the air conditioning. If windows and doors are left open with the air conditioning running the unit will most likely fail. **The first sign will be that the air conditioning unit begins to leak and if this continues it will eventually freeze up and fail.**
4. **PLEASE DO YOUR BIT FOR THE PLANET!** To do your bit to prevent further global warming and reduce power consumption, please remember to **TURN OFF your air conditioning when you leave your room.**
5. Please DO NOT REMOVE the remote control or any batteries from your room.

Rarotonga is a special slice of paradise and you will want to do all possible to keep it that way. Please bear in mind power on the island **is generated by imported, non-renewable diesel**, and costs about 80 cents per kilowatt-hour, as opposed to 28 cents per kWh which is typical for NZ residents. **Please use the air conditioning only when necessary**, and always turn it off (and all lights and other electrical appliances) when you leave your room. Meitaki Ma'ata (many thanks) for helping to keep Rarotonga beautiful and Planet Earth healthy.

To conserve energy, your Room Attendant will turn off your air conditioning if your room is not occupied. If you require assistance with your air conditioning controls, please contact Reception or our Duty Manager by dialling 5000 or pressing the Reception icon on your guest room phone.

2.4. AIRPORT TRANSFERS

Transfers to the airport can be booked through the Reception and should be requested 24 hours prior to departure to ensure availability. Pick-ups are usually about two hours prior to departure but have been known to be as much as four hours prior due to increased security procedures, so please do check with Reception in advance. The bus picks you up from the Resort Lobby entrance, please ensure you have your transfer tickets, luggage, and voucher ready prior to pick-up.

2.8. ATM LOCATIONS

In-house guests can withdraw up to \$100 per room per day at the Reception against selected Mastercard and Visa debit and credit cards which will incur the normal card charges.

2.9. AVARUA TOWN

Rarotonga is the capital of the Cook Islands and the main township on Rarotonga is Avarua, which has a friendly, bustling atmosphere. The nearby port of Avatiu is the main port and hosts cruise ships and many cruising yachts.

Avarua offers such services as banks (ANZ, BSP, Bank of the Cook Islands (BCI) and Western Union), the Post Office, the Police Station (for your Cook Islands Driver's Licence), tourist information office, Cook Islands Library & Museum, the National Museum, supermarkets, Punanga Nui Market for local produce and crafts, pharmacies, a department store, a variety of shops (including a bookshop/newsagent), cafes, bars, restaurants, and nightclubs.

On Rarotonga, **business hours** are generally Monday to Friday 8am-4pm, Saturday 8am-12 noon. The main Punanga Nui Market is open Saturday 7.30am-11.30am.

2.10. BABYSITTING

To arrange babysitting please contact The Rarotongan's Reception, dial 5000 or pressing the Reception icon on your guest room phone. This service costs NZ\$15 per hour inclusive of 15% Government Value Added Tax, and NZ\$22.50 per hour after 11pm and for any extensions past the agreed babysitting finish time. A transportation allowance of NZ\$10 per booking applies, and a meal allowance of NZ\$15 applies to each 4-hour period completed. **Due to the popularity of this service, a minimum of 48 hours' notice is required.** This service is available only to in-house guests and is subject to the availability of babysitters. A maximum number of two children per babysitter applies.

2.11. BANKS

Full banking services are available at **ANZ, Bank of the South Pacific (BSP)** and **Bank of the Cook Islands (BCI)** in Avarua town.

There are several quality **black pearl boutiques** in Avarua town. Notable is the **Bergman's Gallery** which is in a beautiful and painstakingly restored coral and limestone building originally erected by the London Missionary Society as their Sunday school. Bergman's offers an extensive selection of fine art, jewellery, carved black pearls and pearl shell, wood carvings, delicate blown glass pieces, finely woven hats, and bags from Tongareva (Penrhyn) and works by local tivaevae quilt makers. Bergman's is a founding member of the Cook Islands Pearl Guild. Ph: 21-939.

Overall, the **quality, selection and cost of jewellery on Rarotonga is excellent**, especially of gold jewellery. All stores that are members of the Cook Islands Pearl Guild supply a **certificate of authenticity** with your prized black pearl. Colour, lustre, size and regularity of shape determine the value of a Cook Islands black pearl; the bigger, rounder, more lustrous and greater variety of 'lights' a pearl has, the more expensive. Colours of genuine black pearls vary greatly, from pale golden pearls through to dark gold, pink-greys, peacock hues and very deep, dark, mysterious orbs. Many of the pearl shops have an informative brochure showing in detail the way a pearl is valued and the varieties available. Always remember though that beauty is in the eye of the beholder, and if you like it, and it suits you, then yours is the last word!

Travellers Tip! Do buy an exotic Cook Islands black pearl while on your holiday here, for yourself or for a special loved one, it will always be a treasured reminder of Rarotonga.

Takamoa Theological College in Avarua gives one a glimpse into the life of those early missionaries. The College is near to several other notable architectural sights in the area including a beautiful palace and sprawling grounds, a church and early graveyard, and the old **London Missionary Society Sunday School** built in the Spanish Mission style which today houses the Bergman Gallery's art & jewellery. The Takamoa Theological College today continues its tradition of training young Cook Islanders for pastoral duties with the Cook Islands Christian Church (CICC).

Each Sunday Rarotonga's beautiful white coral and limestone churches fill with the soaring songs of worship of their congregations. Visitors are most welcome to attend Sunday services. Please observe appropriate modest attire of shirts and long trousers for men, and at least knee-length skirts or dresses for women, and tops preferably with short or long sleeves (no singlets). Women also often wear a hat. Any small cash donations contributed when the plate is handed around the congregation will be much appreciated.

A bus from The Rarotongan Beach Resort & Lagoonarium leaves at 9.30am Sunday for the Cook Islands Christian Church and St Mary's Catholic Church, both in Arorangi. The bus fare is NZ \$10 per adult return, and \$5 per child under 12 years. At the conclusion of service, you may well find yourself invited by the Pastor to enjoy light refreshments in the nearby meeting hall with the congregation. 2.25. CIGARETTES

2.42. DIVING

Rarotonga's clear, warm waters with fantastic visibility and diversity of marine life make it excellent for diving and snorkelling. If you've never dived there are qualified instructors at several different dive operations around the island who can give expert tuition, and Rarotonga's lagoons are a great place to learn (sure beats your local city swimming pool!). Outside the reef there's a diverse range of diving including interesting drop-offs, a variety of hard corals, rays, sharks, turtles, whales, canyons, caves, tunnels, and shipwrecks. The reef drop-off goes from about 20 to 30 metres down to 4000 metres. Most diving is done at 5 to 40m where visibility is 20 to 60m (100 feet), depending on weather and wind conditions. Usual water temperatures range between 25 to 28 degrees Celsius. Another welcome feature of diving off Rarotonga are the short trips in purpose-built boats, often no more than 10 minutes to superb dive sites, and as the island of Rarotonga is circular there are almost always safe spots for diving with good visibility.

2.45. DRESS CODE

Voltage in the Cook Islands is 240Volt 50HzAC. Three-pin plugs are used, the same as for New Zealand and Australia. Your room has been fitted with a dual voltage outlet for a 110-volt shaver. 2.52. **FISH FEEDING**

Do feel welcome to join our friendly Activities team for fish feeding at 1.30pm daily. You will be amazed at the number of reef fish keen to gather for some tasty titbits. You can even hand-feed the fish down at the water's edge – an unforgettable experience! Call Activities on 5018 for further details.

We have researched and taken advice from various local and overseas experts in respect to fish feeding. The consensus was that on balance;

- Bread was not toxic to the fish; and
- Only certain species were interested in this food source, which tend to be the schooling species; and

- The increase in the population of these species has provided an increased food source for larger species higher up the food chain and therefore, as one example, there has been a noticeable increase in the giant trevally population; and
- In terms of being disruptive to the natural population order, that the Rarotonga Lagoon is severely over-fished and any excess fish populations within the Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary tend to move to other parts of the Rarotonga Lagoon and re-populate those areas where they have a positive impact on the environment as well as provide a fresh food source for the local people; and
- The increase in available fish in the areas outside of the Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary has created goodwill amongst the small but vocal community group that had originally campaigned to be allowed to fish in the Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary. Without broad-based community support, the Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary would have been re-opened to fishing long ago; and
- The fish feeding provides an opportunity for people, particularly children, to be personally engaged with the natural wildlife in the Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary which will hopefully assist in generating increased consciousness about the importance of human stewardship of the natural world; and
- The Rarotongan Beach Resort has played a leadership role in generating and fostering community support for the Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary with visitors and locals alike enjoying personal contact with the fish.

2.53. FISHING

Fishing is not allowed, nor the removal of any shellfish, shells, sea stars (starfish) or any other marine life within the Aroa Lagoon Marine Sanctuary directly in front of The Rarotongan Beach Resort & Lagoonarium and Sanctuary Rarotonga-on the beach.

However, Marlin, Wahoo, Mahimahi (Dolphin Fish), Barracuda, Sailfish, Shark and Tuna such as Yellowfin, Albacore, Dogtooth, Skipjack and Big Eye are just a few of the exciting game fish that you can catch whilst deep sea fishing outside the reef of Rarotonga. Fishing charters provide a great game fishing experience for all skill levels. Take a trip out to the ocean on a deep-sea fishing trip and have a go at catching an amazing array of gamefish from Marlin to Wahoo.

Due to the close proximity of the reef, there are no long journeys out to deep water, and lines are set once out of the harbour ensuring maximum fishing time. Most trips are half day on a boat share with four to six lines, and private charters can also be arranged. Catches usually remain with the boat although some companies do share it out and provide enough for dinner if the catch is sufficient. Morning trips go out at about 8am and afternoon trips at about 1.30pm. Ring the Reception on 5000 or press the Reception icon on your guest room phone and spend an exciting day with your line in the water.

2.54. FOOD PRICES

The Cook Islands produces a lot of its own fresh fruits, vegetables, eggs, breads, and fish, however much of the other food available in our small island nation has to be imported. Because of the relatively low volumes combined with high freight and refrigeration charges, the price of imported foods (such as fresh, air freighted milk, chilled dairy products, frozen foods or imported fresh fruits and vegetables) can be higher in the Cook Islands than in larger countries. Despite this we endeavour to keep our prices competitive with similar-standard resorts in similarly isolated South Pacific locations.

2.55. GAZEBOS

2.70. INSECTS

Your room is fitted with insect screens for protection against life's little nuisances. Your room and surrounding outside area are also regularly sprayed for unwelcome pests. The Resort is however sensitive to concerns about the effects of sprays on human health, so there is a limit to the amount of spraying that can be safely carried out, in line with manufacturers' guidelines.

Please avoid keeping food or drinks out in the open by using your mini bar fridge for food storage at all times, bearing in mind not to overstock and thus over-tax the fridge. Any sweet foods left outside of the fridge or dropped into bedding such as pieces of fruit, candy/lollies, crumbs, drops of fruit juice and so on will attract tiny sugar ants to come inside. Should you have any unwelcome visitors please use the insecticide spray provided in your room. For further assistance please contact Housekeeping, dial 5020 9am-5pm, or dial 5000 or press the Reception icon on your guest room phone for the Reception or Duty Manager.

Travellers Tip! Please remember that in the tropics things grow to lush proportions, and while some pests may look bigger than at home, they are more of a nuisance than anything else. Many insects are attracted to light, so it will help to turn off your lights when leaving your

room at night. Talking of visitors, sometimes a moko (gecko) may find her way into your room in the early evening. She's after insects or little titbits of soft, sweet fruits like banana or pawpaw. Other than sometimes making a clicking sound (her 'bark') and occasionally leaving her 'calling card' she is completely harmless to humans. She will mostly scurry about on the ceiling or upper walls near the light and will go into hiding during the broad light of day, often outside among the leafy bushes.

2.76. ISLAND TIME

The Cook Islands are renowned for warm friendly people and a relaxed pace of life. This is often called "Island Time" and **tuning into island time is certainly the best way to completely relax and enjoy your holiday on Rarotonga.** To avoid any frustration please consider that any timings you are given in the islands can sometimes be more of an approximation than a deadline. Remembering this will save you any unnecessary stress. Slow service however is not acceptable within the Resort; please contact the Duty Manager on 0 if you have any concerns.



Travellers Tip! Take a walk down Aroa Beach. Turn around and walk back at half the pace. Now you're starting to get into the groove of Island Time! You know what they say, **"When in Rarotonga, do as the Rarotongans do!"**

2.77. KAYAKING and STAND-UP PADDLEBOARDING

Kayaking and stand-up paddle-boarding are safe and enjoyable pastimes within **Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary**. The Resort offers our guests complimentary one-and two-seater kayaks and stand-up paddleboards, plus the **Daily Activities Programme** includes guided snorkelling and kayak tours led by our Activities Team who enjoy sharing their extensive knowledge and old stories of the area.

Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary is safe for swimming and snorkelling at all tides and is encircled by a living coral reef which separates the lagoon from the open Pacific Ocean.

Please note that there are no lifeguards on duty at Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary or anywhere on Rarotonga. Therefore, we recommend the following water safety guidelines;

- always keep children within arm's length in or near the water
- check the water and weather conditions
- know your physical limits and experience
- never be in the water alone
- if in doubt, stay out of the water
- wear a buoyancy-vest or life jacket when kayaking or paddle boarding
- do not touch any marine life or coral
- always wear reef shoes
- if you need to stand up, wave your foot a few centimeters above the bottom to clear the area you will be standing on of any marine life
- use eco-friendly sunscreen or wear a T-Shirt or wet suit for sun protection
- do not enter the water after drinking alcohol
- if you need help, keep calm, and raise your hand in the air

The passages from the Rarotonga Lagoon to the open ocean can be very dangerous. The nearest passage to The Rarotongan and Sanctuary is Rutaki Passage and is over a kilometre to the east of the Resort. **Under no circumstances should you enter the Rutaki Passage, or any other passage in Rarotonga, except with organised and certified tour operators with experienced guides and proper safety protocols.**

These passages are dangerous for swimming, snorkelling, fishing, kayaking, and surfing, and a number of local fishermen and tourist snorkellers have drowned there over the years. **Do not at any time paddle out through (or over) the reef into the open ocean.**

2.78. KEYS

The Rarotongan Beach Resort and Sanctuary Rarotonga has two guest room key systems – the swipe card and the traditional key system. For your convenience and safety, please leave your room key at Reception when leaving the Resort and ensure the door to your room is properly closed and locked. If your Room Attendant finds your door unlocked and your room unoccupied when servicing it, the attendant will lock the door upon leaving to ensure the security of your belongings. Replacement charge for a lost or misplaced room key is NZ\$45. For assistance on operating the key system, please contact Reception, dial 5000 or press the Reception icon on your guest room phone.

2.79. KIDS BABYSITTING

Babysitting costs NZ\$15 per hour inclusive of 15% VAT (Government Value Added Tax), and NZ\$22.50 per hour after 11pm and for any extensions past the agreed babysitting finish time. A transportation allowance of NZ\$10 per booking applies, and a meal allowance of NZ\$15 applies to each four-hour period completed. Due to the popularity of this service, a minimum of 48 hours' notice is required. This service is available only to in-house guests of The Rarotongan and is subject to the availability of babysitters. A maximum number of two children per babysitter applies. To arrange babysitting please contact Reception, dial 5000 or press the Reception icon on your guest room phone.

2.80. KIDS CLUB

The Rarotongan Beach Resort & Lagoonarium offers Kids Stay & Play FREE! in conjunction with our **Moko Kids Club**, open year-round **Monday-Saturday 9am-12noon, 2pm-5pm + 7pm-9pm.**

KIDS PLAY FREE! at Moko which caters for children aged 4-11 years inclusive. Children under four are also welcome to join the fun when supervised by a parent or babysitter. A large, colourful and well-equipped family facility for Resort guests, Moko Kids Club provides kids with a fantastic range of toys, books, board games, Lego, paints & crafts, trampoline, play shop, ride-on, play & sports equipment, video games, videos and a Kids Nature & Culture Activities Programme including lessons in island (hula) dancing and ei (lei) making, coconut painting,

moko (gecko) hunting, learn to speak some words of Cook Islands Māori and much more, all under the supervision of the friendly Kids Club Team.

KIDS STAY FREE! when sharing with their parents at The Rarotongan. Most room types accept 2 adults + 2 children/teens to 16 years inclusive. Our self-catering Two-Bedroom Beachside Suites, Grand Beachfront Suites and Three-Bedroom Private Pool & Spa Villa Lime Blossom accept up to 4 children/teens. Three-Bedroom Private Pool Villa Onemaru accepts up to 6 children/teens (with 4 adults). Dial 5000 or press the Reception icon on your guest room phone for the Reception.

Children staying in-house at The Rarotongan can use the Moko Kids Club and Teen Zone free of charge.

For visitors staying elsewhere on the island, admission into the Little Dolphin's Mini Waterpark is included in the NZ\$45 per child, per session, admission fee for the Moko Kids Club or Teen Zone.

The Rarotongan offers **FREE cots and baby baths** for your baby or toddler. We also offer **FREE bunk beds** to help maximize space in your room when travelling with children. All Beachside Rooms and Beachfront Rooms can be provided as **interconnecting**, with several in a row; please request when making your booking. Should you prefer **ground-level**, please request at time of booking. Dial 5000 or press the Reception icon on your guest room phone for the Reception.

2.83. KIDS-LITTLE DOLPHINS MINI WATERPARK

The **Little Dolphins Mini Waterpark** is located beside the Activities Hut and Moko Kids Club has a range of fun water-based activities allowing kids to splash around in a safe environment. Check with the **Moko Kids Club** team for opening hours as all waterpark sessions are conducted under the supervision of Kids Club staff.

Please arrange for your children to be wearing suitable swimwear, sun protection and have fresh beach towels with them. Please pick up your children at the conclusion of the waterpark session. A charge of NZ\$1 per minute applies for late pick up of children. The waterpark caters for children aged to 11 years inclusive. Children staying in-house can use the waterpark for FREE. For guests staying elsewhere on the island admission into the waterpark is included in the NZ\$45 per child, per session admission into the Moko Kids Club or Teen Zone.

2.84. KIDS-SAFETY TIPS

Here are a few handy hints from our team at The Rarotongan and Moko Kids Club on **travelling with children** to help make everybody's holiday fun and hassle-free. If you're travelling with young children who are picky eaters, consider bringing with you (or buying as soon as you arrive) their favourite snacks, formula, drinks, toiletries or whatever you may need to ensure the comfort of your youngster. Be aware that at times the island's local stores run out of speciality items like soymilk/goat's milk until the next boat comes in. Another vital travelling companion is Children's Pamol or Panadol syrup (and a measuring spoon) to help control any unexpected earache, fever, or other pain.

When travelling with children, be it on planes, buses, boats, bicycles or on foot, whether for long or short trips, ensure you have **plenty of their favourite drinks and snacks**, a change of clothes, and even a folding umbrella for sun or showers. Trips can be delayed, and children and babies in the tropics can quickly dehydrate, get chilled if caught out in rain, or experience flagging energy and start becoming fractious.

In the tropics it certainly always pays to have an **antihistamine cream** as part of your arsenal. If your youngster is troubled by mosquito bites, the locals here swear by Vicks Vapour-rub for calming down the itching and swelling. Another excellent balm is Mauke Miracle Oil made here in the Cook Islands from pure coconut oil and the essences of traditional medicinal plants from the outer island of Mauke. It's used to help relieve bites, stings, rashes, burns and even warts.

If you're planning to hire a car on Rarotonga, we recommend you bring your own **baby car safety seat** or enquire at your rental car company.

It's always a good idea to have a **kids activity pack** while travelling, be it an electronic device, colouring-in book and pens or crayons, a storybook, a magnetic travelling game or a pack of cards.

2.85. KIDS-TEEN ZONE

Located beside the Activities Hut and Moko Kids Club, the Teen Zone is FREE for in-house guests aged 12-16 years. Try out scuba diving in the pool, ukulele and log drumming sessions, beach soccer, crab races, karaoke, table tennis, snorkelling tour, fish feeding, beach volleyball, tennis, pool table competition, gaming consoles. There's also hula dancing and 'ei making lessons, pareu tying, crab hunting, water volleyball, bingo and other fun teen activities. Talk to one of our friendly Activities team, dial 5018.

2.88. LAUNDROMAT

Guest Laundry services are located as follows: up the ramp in the 7300/7400 village area and up the ramp in the 7500 Village area of The Rarotongan; and in the laundry area of the Sanctuary's 6700 village. Washing, drying, and ironing facilities are available.

The washing machines and dryers are token operated. Tokens cost NZ\$8 each and laundry powder is NZ\$1 per sachet, both from Reception. This service is provided on a cost recovery

basis; charges are higher than at a laundromat in a larger country due to the much higher costs of electricity in the Cook Islands.

A standard washing cycle takes approximately 45 minutes. As a courtesy to other guests please retrieve your laundry at the completion of the washing or drying cycle.

Please **DO NOT place any clothing over the light shades** in your guestroom for drying. This damages the shades and is also a fire hazard. Please **do not hang washing to dry outside of your room**. Your guest room is also supplied with an iron and ironing board.

2.89. LAUNDRY

For same-day laundry service Monday to Friday, please place your laundry in the special plastic bag provided in your room, complete the laundry docket, and advise Reception by 9am, dial 5000 or press the Reception icon on your guest room phone to have it picked up. Your laundry will be returned by 5pm on the same day.

2.90. LIBRARY

There are new books for sale as well as a used-book exchange programme located in the Raro Style Gift Shop. Please return library books after use and bring a book to swap in the book exchange. This is a complimentary service, however a charge of NZ\$35 applies for each book not returned. The Raro Style Gift Shop is located alongside the Reception at The Rarotongan and is open 24/7.

The **Library and Historical Society Museum** is in Avarua Township, where you can browse for hours and books may be checked out by making arrangements with the Librarian. Visitors pay a deposit of NZ\$15 (refundable when you return the books before leaving the island) and a monthly fee of only NZ\$10. The Library is open Monday to Saturday 9am-1pm and Tuesday 4pm-7pm.

2.95. MARINE SANCTUARY – RA’UI

1 March 2000 was an historic day for **The Rarotongan Beach Resort & Lagoonarium** with the placing of a ra’ui upon Aroa Lagoon by the elders of the local community, with whom the Resort had worked closely.

A ra’ui is a traditional taboo, in this case a traditional marine sanctuary which bans fishing or the taking or disturbing of any shellfish, reef life, shells or coral from the lagoon and for 100m beyond the reef. On 1 March 2000 local Cook Islands Maori elders gathered for a formal traditional ceremony at the water’s edge on Aroa Beach in front of The Rarotongan to mark the ra’ui. Just as the ra’ui was being declared following speeches, prayers, and the laying of rauti upon the waters, two kakaia (pure-white love terns) flew close overhead, and this was seen by those gathered as a special blessing and endorsement from above of this important event. The ra’ui provides valuable protection for the marine life in Aroa Lagoon, especially beneficial because Aroa – being a dynamic, sparkling clean lagoon - is an important breeding area for fish.

It is vital that **Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary** be protected by visitors and locals alike, for the enjoyment of all today and for many generations to come. No fishing is allowed, nor the removal of any shellfish, shells, sea stars (starfish) or any other marine life.

The ra’ui has been a big environmental boost for the lagoon life in Aroa and meant that all of The Rarotongan’s guests who love to snorkel have witnessed an ever-growing kaleidoscope of teeming, friendly tropical fish. Please refer to the **Snorkelling Map** of Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary on the back of our **Resort Map**. To learn more about Aroa Lagoon’s marine life and see a Fish ID Chart, contact the Activities Hut on 5018.

2.96. MARKET

Saturday is market day at the **Punanga Nui Market** (beside Rarotonga Wharf, Avarua) open approximately 7.30am-11.30am. The first bus leaves at 7.30am from The Rarotongan and drops you directly at the market. The market offers a wide range of fresh local produce, cooked food and treats, drinking coconuts, arts, jewellery, carvings, handicrafts, T-shirts and pareu (sarong), and traditional dancers and bands often perform live.

2.98. MICROWAVES

Microwaves are complimentary in all rooms at The Rarotongan Beach Resort & Lagoonarium. Complimentary microwaves can be supplied for guests in Sanctuary Rarotonga-on the beach upon request. Dial 5000 or press the Reception icon on your guest room phone for the Reception.

2.99. MOSQUITOES/DENGUE FEVER

For your comfort and safety your guestroom at the Resort has an insect screen to keep out mosquitoes which, due to the Resort's close proximity to the coast, are not common day or night. We also take measures to keep the entire Resort grounds free from potential mosquito breeding areas, thus further reducing any incidence of mosquitoes.

However, mosquitoes can be a nuisance further inland, particularly during the warmer months of the year, and we recommend you take precautions against being bitten if you plan to trek or take a 4WD Mountain Safari into the interior. Wear a strong insect repellent, take some vitamin B1 tablets to change the texture and taste of the skin making it unpleasant for mosquitoes, and/or wear clothing that covers areas of skin susceptible to being bitten, such as the arms, shoulders, back, legs and ankles.

All around the island house-proud Rarotongans are regularly inspected by public health inspectors to ensure they are doing all possible to minimize mosquito-breeding sites.

Please assist us to keep the Cook Islands free of dengue by following the simple guidelines outlined in this advisory statement below from the Ministry of Health:

Dengue can produce symptoms like those of other diseases such as influenza. It is caused by a virus carried by a (day biting) mosquito, from a sick person to a healthy one. It can take 5 to 15 days from contact to when the first symptoms may begin to appear.

The symptoms include:

- Sudden high fever
- Pains in the muscles or joints
- Headache and backache
- Pain on moving the eyes
- Skin rash, with or without itching
- Loss of appetite and weakness

If you experience any of the above symptoms or signs within the next 2-3 weeks, see a doctor. Inform the doctor (or nurse) about countries you have visited recently, and please also contact the Public Health Department of the Cook Islands Ministry of Health.

Malaria is not endemic in the Cook Islands.

For further information please contact the Director of Public Health or the Chief Health Inspector, Ph 29 110.

Travellers Tip! The experienced guides at Takitumu Conservation Area have a great recipe for homemade insect repellent: mix half coconut oil with half Dettol (an antiseptic) and apply liberally. They insist it keeps the mossies at bay when they're working in the bush or keeping still for hours while bird watching! If you do get bitten, try the locals' favourite mossie balm: Vicks Vapour-rub, available at the on-site Raro Style Gift Shop.

2.100. NIGHT SNORKELLING TOURS

Explore the marine life of Aroa Lagoonarium after sundown when the "night shift" of the marine world comes out. The underwater nightlife is a totally "different world" - different fish, different experience, not to be missed. If you're enjoying snorkelling during the day, continue that experience into the night. You may even see a parrotfish asleep in his 'jelly cocoon'. Wet suits, snorkelling mask, flippers, and torch are provided. NZ\$25 per adult and half price for children aged 9-11 years accompanied by one parent per child. Maximum and minimum numbers apply. Basic swimming and snorkelling skills and basic fitness necessary. Tours proceed at discretion of guide and are subject to weather and tide conditions. On the **4WD Raro Mountain Safari Tour** colourful local guides take you off-the-beaten-track along the island's back roads, up inland valleys and steep mountain tracks to gain incredible vistas out into the blue Pacific. See historic sacred sites and native plants used for traditional medicine, for food, as building materials, for weapons, for costumes, and as sources of light in the days before electricity and hear local myths and legends.

2.112. REEF WALKING

To preserve the living reef and to avoid getting cut by the sharp corals (notorious for becoming badly infected), walking on the reef is discouraged. Instead, snorkel in the shallows between the coral 'fingers' which extend into the lagoon from the encircling reef. Look out for yellowish or greenish **Slate-Spined Sea Urchins**, so-called because today's island grandmothers and grandfathers used to write their school lessons on slates using the spines of these sea urchins as 'chalk'! Also, octopus often burrow into their lairs along the reef. Please always remember never to touch living coral, and to respect the **Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary** by not touching, disturbing or catching any living or dead marine life, corals, shells, reef fish, etc. The Ra'ui Golden Rule is '**Look But Don't Touch**'. Our **Snorkelling Map** sets out a range of self-guided tours. For further information dial 5018 for the Activities Hut.

2.113. RENTAL CARS AND MOTORBIKES

Having your own transport is a great way to see Rarotonga, you can stop and see anything you like from roadside stalls, shops, museums, galleries, cafes, restaurants, to beautiful beach spots ideal for a picnic. CAR HIRE

To rent a car, guests must be **18 years or older and hold a full car driver licence** (i.e., not a restricted or learner licence) from your own country or an international licence. If you do not have a current valid licence, you can take a test with the Cook Islands Police to get a Cook Islands drivers licence. The cost for this is \$10 for the theory test, \$10 for the practical test and \$20 for a thirty-day licence.

SCOOTER AND MOTORBIKE HIRE

All motorbike and scooter drivers are required to have a current Cook Islands Drivers Licence. If you do not have a full motorbike licence from your country of origin or international motorbike licence, you must obtain a **Visitor's Licence** from the Cook Islands Police Station headquarters in Avarua. You must pass a theory test (NZ\$10) and a practical test (NZ\$10) before obtaining a Visitor's Drivers Licence (NZ\$20); total NZ\$40. **Both rider and passenger must wear a safety helmet; the fine is NZ\$500.** The Police Station Drivers Licensing Desk is open Monday to Friday, 9am-4pm, and Saturday 9am-1pm.

Speed Limits are a maximum of 50km per hour on all roads, excluding the main road in Avarua town and within the Muri area where the limit is 30km per hour.

The Cook Islands Police also regularly conducts road safety campaigns to combat speeding and drink driving which can result in criminal convictions and fines for visitors and local residents alike!

Travellers Tip! If you are unused to driving motorcycles, we strongly recommend you travel in the greater safety of a car. Our island roads present unpredictable hazards without discrimination to locals and visitors alike, whether wandering jungle chickens, dogs, cats, pigs, cows, bulls, goats or horses, loose gravel, potholes, narrow roads with no footpaths, pedestrians, joggers, wandering toddlers, slow moving tractors, or earth-moving equipment, speeding trucks, sharp bends, and distracted motorists.

Motorcyclists are at risk of grazes and scrapes from motorbike mishaps, called the "Honda Rash" by locals. Someone who has a "Rarotonga tattoo" on their calf has had a hot and painful encounter with a motorbike exhaust pipe. Rarotonga Hospital receives motorbike accident victims virtually daily, often with serious injuries.

If you feel that the freedom and romance of a ride around the island on a motorcycle is a must, **wear your safety helmet as required by law.** When hiring a car, use a child's safety car seat. As there are limited supplies during high season, please book any additional requirements at the time of booking your car or motorbike. Please dispose of your cigarette butt thoughtfully in the many coconut carved wooden ashtrays (not in the gardens, walkways, decks or on the beach please). Cigarettes can be purchased on-site at the Raro Style Gift Shop. 2.125. SNORKELLING

A few steps from your room at The Rarotongan you can **snorkel straight off the white sands of Aroa Beach** in the **underwater wonderland of the Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary**, protected by the encircling natural coral reef. Swim with rainbow-coloured angel, parrot, butterfly, squirrel, goat, rabbit, unicorn, box and Picasso fish and beautiful wrasses such as sunset and bird, all in chest-deep, clear warm waters. The snorkelling here is so good many of our guests have compared it to Australia's Great Barrier Reef, Fiji, Bonaire, or other great snorkelling locations around the world. If you've never snorkelled before, you'll be amazed at how easy and rewarding it is. Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary offers Rarotonga's best snorkelling because it is a fish breeding area and a **traditional marine sanctuary** (a ra'ui). In the Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary you can **swim or snorkel at any tide**, not so in most parts of the island. Resort guests get complimentary 3-hour hire of snorkelling masks, flippers, and reef shoes from the Activities Hut, along with invaluable local knowledge. **Snorkelling safaris, snorkelling lessons** and **fish feeding** are all part of The Rarotongan's **Daily Activities Programme**. Check out our Snorkelling Map to plan your self-guided snorkelling adventure. Dial 5018 for the Activities Hut.



Night Snorkelling Tour. Explore Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary after dark when the 'night shift' comes out. If you loved snorkelling during daylight continue that experience after sundown and open your eyes to the underwater nightlife. You might even spot a parrot fish snug in its 'sleeping cocoon'. Wet suits, snorkelling masks, flippers, reef shoes and torch provided. NZ\$25 per adult, half price for children 9-11 years accompanied by one parent per child. Basic swimming and snorkelling skills and basic fitness required. For a unique experience talk to The Rarotongan's Activities Team about our Night Snorkelling Tour; see how different the reef life is after dark. Tour subject to maximum and minimum numbers, weather and tides, so book early. Bookings essential and are weather dependent, dial 5018, Activities Hut, or 5000 or press the Reception icon on your guest room phone for Reception.

Travellers Tips!

Bring or buy your own snorkelling gear and reef shoes as you then have the confidence of them fitting you perfectly and being able to use them at any time to suit, and for as long as you wish, as well as take them with you around the island to try out other snorkelling spots. **Go snorkelling soon after you arrive.** If you find yourself hooked, then you've still got plenty of time to do loads more. Invest in a **waterproof cover for your smartphone** or a

disposable underwater camera. Buy a waterproof **Cook Islands Fish Identification (ID) Chart**. The onsite Raro Style Gift Shop and the Dive Shop in Avarua stock them; attach one to your wrist (using the rubber band threaded through the hole in the corner of the chart) when snorkelling. Fish are fascinating – some have different colourations as males/females or in their juvenile phases, wrasses have independently moving eyes, parrot fishes sleep in a 'jelly cocoon', one eye of a peacock flounder migrates to join the other one as it turns into a flatfish, clown fish have a special coating to protect them from toxic anemones. So many mysteries, so little time.

Always **wear your reef shoes or flippers** when in the lagoon for a swim, snorkel, kayak or stand-up paddleboard to protect your feet from coral cuts or stings from stepping on a spiny black sea urchin or stonefish. The stonefish has stinging spines which rise along the ridge on its back. It is well camouflaged for survival, either sitting on corals trying to look like a stone or sitting slightly submerged on the sandy bottom of the lagoon. Locals stung by a stonefish report that it's very painful. Stonefish are rare, but it's wise to **always wear protective**

footwear in the lagoon. Avoid walking or trampling through the water, instead swim, float or glide your feet along; should there be a stonefish around, it will then have warning to avoid you. Thousands of visitors enjoy Rarotonga's lagoons without any incident, but you don't want to be the exception.



Please note that the **Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary** is a strict **NO TOUCH ZONE**, and **fishing is strictly forbidden**. The **Golden Rule of the Ra'ui is DO NOT TOUCH**, disturb, remove, or kill any marine life, which includes reef fish, octopus, clams, corals, shells, shellfish, urchins etc. **DO NOT KNOCK OR BUMP ANY LIVING CORALS with your flippers**, which can be easy to do accidentally. **DO NOT STAND ON THE CORALS** when out in the lagoon. Corals are beautiful and delicate colonies of living organisms which take decades to grow and one loose or heavy foot can destroy many years of growth.

If you're snorkelling or swimming in the lagoon you may feel a slight nip on your calf or thigh, that is likely to be caused by the **Picasso Trigger Fish** which is trying to keep you away from its territory to protect its young. This usually occurs during breeding times (not seasonal) and will not cause any harm other than a tiny nip. Swim away to another fascinating area of the lagoon.

These handy hints will ensure you get the most out of your exciting snorkelling adventure and that the marine environment is still there for everyone to enjoy in future. **Happy snorkelling in Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary for Rarotonga's best snorkelling!**

At 1.30pm daily Monday to Friday, join our friendly Activities Team for **Fish Feeding**. You can even hand-feed the fish down at the water's edge – an unforgettable experience! Call Activities on 5018 for further details.

We have researched and taken advice from various local and overseas experts regarding Fish Feeding. The consensus was;

- Bread is not toxic to the fish; and
- Only certain species are interested in this food source which tend to be the schooling species; and
- The increase in the population of these species has provided an increased food source for larger species higher up the food chain and therefore there has been a noticeable increase in the giant trevally population, for example; and
- In terms of being disruptive to the natural population order: the Rarotonga lagoon is severely over-fished and as excess populations within the Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary move to other parts of the lagoon it leads to re-population of those areas

whereby, they have a positive impact on the environment as well as provide a fresh food source for the local people; and

- The increase in available fish in the areas outside of the Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary has created goodwill amongst the small but vocal community group that had originally campaigned to be allowed to fish in the Marine Sanctuary. Without broad-based community support, the Marine Sanctuary would have been re-opened to fishing some time ago; and
- The Fish Feeding activity provides an opportunity for people, particularly children, to be personally engaged with the natural wildlife in the Marine Sanctuary which will hopefully assist in generating more consciousness about the importance of human stewardship of the natural world; and
- The Rarotongan played the leadership role in generating, fostering, and maintaining community support for the Marine Sanctuary, with visitors and locals alike enjoying personal contact with the fish.

2.128. SWIMMING

Between the Activities Hut and the beach at The Rarotongan Beach Resort & Lagoonarium is the Waterfalls Swimming Pool. And because The Rarotongan is set on the sunshine southwest coast, there’s sunshine all day on the pool, the beach, and the lagoon. Here the sun lasts until sunset; on the sun rise side of the island (Muri) the sun is often off the beach by 3.30/4pm. Beside our pool and on the beach, there are plenty of comfortable loungers to enjoy, so grab your complimentary pool / beach towel from the Activities Hut and make



yourself comfortable for another day in Paradise. After you've soaked up some rays, take a cool dip then enjoy a cool drink from Captain Andy's Bar.

At Sanctuary Rarotonga there is a secluded **adults-only swimming pool with swim-up bar** set in beautiful tropical gardens, restricted to Sanctuary guests only.

Wherever you are at The Rarotongan or Sanctuary, you are mere steps away from the pristine waters of Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary. This protected sanctuary is home to diverse prolific marine life and is sheltered from the open ocean by the outlying coral reef. **Swim, snorkel, kayak, stand-up paddleboard and explore the Marine Sanctuary at any tide.** Fishing is not allowed in the Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary which has been set aside for protection of our tropical marine wildlife for future generations, and we ask that you experience it to its fullest whilst respecting the beauty and uniqueness of one of nature's miracles.

2.129. SUNSETS

The Rarotongan Beach Resort & Lagoonarium and Sanctuary Rarotonga-on the beach are set right on Rarotonga's best beach, Aroa Beach, on the sunshine southwest coast where the sun sets, and the moon rises. Directly in front of the resorts, the sky is often ablaze at dusk with a breathtaking show of ever-changing colours. Experiencing one of these spectacular tropical sunsets will be a memorable part of your South Seas holiday, especially if you're kicking back on the lagoon deck with a sunset cocktail, a cool glass of wine or beer from Captain Andy's Beach Bar. Or take an evening stroll on the twilight beach hand-in-hand and gaze out at the shimmering waters of Aroa Lagoon (the Lagoon of Love). Sunset times vary throughout the year but look out between 6pm-6.50pm from March to October, and 7pm-7.30pm during the longer summer months of November to February. Be sure to take your camera or smartphone to capture some dazzling sunset shots and selfies for Facebook or Instagram.

Travellers Tip!

Being in the Cook Islands any time between November to February is especially rewarding because it means you get to enjoy longer summer days, gorgeous balmy tropical weather, frangipanis in bloom and ripe mangoes as well. It's why we call it our Frangipani Season. Stunning.

2.130. SURFING

There is surfing on Rarotonga but there are no shore breaks, the island being almost completely surrounded by coral reef. There are a couple of passages through the reef which surfers use; otherwise, the surf breaks onto the reef and hence can be very dangerous.



Most of the locals paddle out; only one of the surfing spots is far enough to warrant taking a boat out. Conditions can be treacherous even for experienced locals, so get in touch with one of the local surfers to show you the best spots. Please note that there is no life guard, coast guard or rescue service on Rarotonga.

2.131. TAKITUMU CONSERVATION AREA TOUR

The Takitumu Conservation Area is on Rarotonga's south-eastern side and is managed by the traditional landowners of the district. The volunteer guardians from time to time accept visitors to accompany them as they go about their conservation work in this lush tropical forest, which includes the Giant King Fern, giant taro, the Rarotonga orchid and rare ground orchid, wild guavas, wild hibiscus, and the prized sunset coloured Pua Neinei, which grows only at the highest reaches of the Rarotonga interior and nowhere else in the world. You also have the chance to see such endemic native birds as the rare, chatty Rarotongan Flycatcher or kakerori, which was successfully brought back from the brink of extinction, the Cook Islands Fruit Dove (kukupa), and the Rarotonga Starling (i'oi). At the top of your climb, you are greeted by panoramic views across the blue Pacific Ocean. The gentle amble requires a moderate level of fitness. Wear good walking shoes, take sun protection, a drink, and a mosquito repellent with you (the Takitumu conservation guardians swear by their homemade recipe of half Dettol antiseptic solution, half coconut oil). For more information about the possibility of joining the conservation guardians, please dial the Reception on 5000 or press the Reception icon on your guest room phone.

2.132. "TATTOO" & "TATAU"

The word "Tattoo" comes from the Polynesian word "Tatau". Tattoos first became known to the Western World when early European sailors to Polynesia returned with not only tales of walking works of art but tattoos of their own.

The style of the Polynesian Tatau varies within Polynesia with the Cook Islands, Tahiti, Marquesas, Samoa, Rapa Nui Easter Island and Aotearoa New Zealand all having their own distinctive styles.

The Tatau art form is actively practiced on Rarotonga and there are several professional Tatau artists that design beautiful, personalised, Polynesian body art incorporating traditional and contemporary patterns.

A Government Value Added Tax of 15% is **included in all prices at the Resort**. This tax is required by Cook Islands Law, which requires the tax to be included in all pricing.

Travellers Tip! Taxi companies can be unreliable; give yourself plenty of time in case of delays. Ask the driver what the charge will be before you board to avoid any unpleasant

surprises. If you're going out for dinner you may find the 2-way cab charge costs you more than your meals, thus the bus or hire car provides an alternative option.

2.135. TEEN ZONE

The Teen Zone is free for in-house guests of The Rarotongan aged 12-16 years. Enjoy stand-up paddle boarding, kayaking, snorkelling, fish feeding, scuba diving sessions, ukulele and log drumming sessions, video games, table tennis, pool table competition, tennis, beach soccer, water volleyball, beach volleyball. 2.136. TELEPHONE SERVICES

Your room phone offers you direct dial local and international call services (IDD). For an outside line, dial 9. To call another room, please dial the room number. Country codes and information are listed in the front of the Vodafone Cook Islands Telephone Directory.

To dial an international line, you need to dial 9 for an outside line, followed by '00' then the country code. Please note that billing commences (by the local telephone company, Vodafone Cook Islands) four seconds after an overseas connection has been made, irrespective of whether the caller gets to talk to anyone or not. A charge will incur from this time forward until the receiver is replaced. For further information look in your Vodafone Cook Islands Telephone Directory, call Vodafone on 9-010 or dial 5000 or press the Reception icon on your guest room phone for the Reception.

Travellers Tip! Telecommunications charges in the Cook Islands are much higher than you may be used to at home due to our remote location, small size and because there is only one telephone company allowed to operate here. For further information on call charges, please dial 5000 or press the Reception icon on your guest room phone for Reception.

2.137. TELEVISION

The Resort offers multiple TV channels including CNN, BBC, ESPN, NHK, Discovery, Discovery Kids, Nickelodeon, Disney, Cook Islands Television, Vaka TV as well as live coverage of many international sport events, particularly those popular in New Zealand and Australia such as rugby, rugby league, netball, soccer, etc. There is also a Resort Information Channel with images of The Rarotongan Beach Resort & Lagoonarium, Sanctuary Rarotonga-on the beach and Aitutaki Lagoon Private Island Resort.

Additionally, many guests bring their own movies on a portable hard drive which plugs directly into the TV.

The local **Cook Islands Television** channel is also available; this includes Australia Network during the morning, religious programming, and local programming. Cook Islands Local News is on at 7pm Monday to Friday, and at 8.30pm TVNZ's One News plays nightly (at 7.30pm during daylight savings).

There are big screen satellite TVs in the Sports Bar near Captain Andy's Beach Bar & Grill. Most of the major sports events covered by Television New Zealand, such as rugby, league, netball, cricket, and golf are aired on Cook Islands Television, Ph 29 460. The satellite TV in the Sports Bar screens a wider range of major sports events live that are not on Cook Islands Television.

2.138. TENNIS

Complimentary tennis rackets and balls available from the Activities Hut. To book a court, dial the Activities Hut 5018.

2.139. THE GAMES ROOM & BOARD GAMES

The Games Room is equipped with table tennis, pool table, chess, draughts, and other games for your enjoyment. A selection of board games is also available from the Activities Hut,

particularly important for the kids on a rainy day. Please return all borrowed items to the Activities Hut by 9am the following morning. A fee of NZ \$20 per item is charged to your room for late return and cost price per item is charged for non-return. Contact the Activities Hut on 5018.

2.140. TIME ZONES

Please ensure you have the correct time and date of arrival and departure to/from Rarotonga if you are crossing the **International Date Line**. It is not uncommon for guests to miss flights they thought were going a day later as **the Cook Islands is located across the dateline from New Zealand and Australia, it's a day behind**. New Zealand and Fiji are 22 hours ahead of the Cook Islands, Australia is 20 hours ahead, and the USA and Canada are 3 hours ahead. Please note that these times are approximate only and do not factor in summertime 'daylight saving'. The international time zone is GMT 10, so the Cook Islands are in the same time zone as Hawaii. For further information you can access your local time zone at www.worldclock.com. The Cook Islands is among the last places on Earth to see the sun set each day. If you require further assistance please contact Reception on 5000 or press the Reception icon on your guest room phone.

2.141. TIPPING

Tipping in the Cook Islands is not obligatory however if you have received excellent service a tip of 10% will be much appreciated and gratefully received. 2.145. VISITORS TO THE RESORT

To facilitate the comfort, safety and security of all registered guests staying at the Resort, please note that only registered guests are permitted in the guest rooms or the areas surrounding the guest rooms.

2.146. WAKE-UP CALLS/ ALARMS

Your room is fitted with a Radio Alarm Clock which you can program with your alarm. For assistance in setting your alarm clock, please dial 5000 or press the Reception icon on your guest room phone for the Reception. Alternatively, you can also book your wake-up call with the Reception.

2.147. WALKING & HIKING

As most of Rarotonga's population lives on the narrow coastal fringe, the lush mountainous interior is virtually uninhabited and can be reached only by hiking tracks and trails. While there are walks and trails that are safe and accessible for all levels of fitness, we would recommend you go on an organised walking tour to get the most out of the knowledge and experience of the local guides, and to save becoming lost in unfamiliar terrain. Some trails

shown on maps may have become overgrown, and it is not fun sleeping rough overnight with limited food and water even in Paradise.

We have included several local walking maps for your enjoyment which can all be started at The Rarotongan Beach Resort or Sanctuary Resort. Please stop by Reception on your way out to collect your personal copy of our walking map.

Pa's Mountain Walk offers a 2.5-hour **Nature Walk** and a strenuous 3-hour **Cross Island Trek**. If you are looking to find out all about Rarotonga's amazing flora and fauna the Nature Walk is a must. Alternatively, if you are fit and keen for a challenging hike into the high mountains finishing with a dip in the surprisingly cool Papua (Wigmore's) Waterfall give the Cross Island Trek a go. You'll learn about local legends, fauna, flora, and medicinal plants. Transport is provided along with a light lunch and fruit in season. Wear good walking shoes and take plenty of water to ensure you have the best walk possible. Pa's Mountain Walks can be booked through Reception dial 5000.

Cross Island Trek: Please note for your own safety that the Cook Islands Tourism Corporation recommends that visitors not attempt the Cross-Island Trek without an experienced local guide. The path can quickly become overgrown, and soil erosion can also make parts of it particularly hazardous, plus if you take a wrong turn, you can become disorientated in the thick tropical jungle. From time to time, the Cook Islands Police are called out to rescue lost hikers who had to spend the night out in the jungle surrounded by swarms of hungry mosquitoes! Going with an experienced guide enriches your walk with deep local insights and colourful yarns.

Travellers Tip! Even if you're going on a guided tour, ensure you **take with you plenty of drinking water** (and even a small pick-me-up snack) as it can get very hot and you can quickly become dehydrated, especially if your body is not used to the tropical conditions. The heat can be especially taxing for those with concerns about their hearts, so try to pick a cooler, preferably overcast day if you're keen to hike up to the Papua (Wigmore's) Waterfall or up into the mountainous interior. Also, take your swimsuit and sun block. Most of all, enjoy!

2.148. WATERPARK

Little Dolphins Mini Waterpark, located near the Activities Hut, has a range of fun water-based activities allowing kids to splash around in a safe environment. Check with the Moko Kids Club for the opening hours as all Waterpark sessions are conducted under the supervision of Kids Club staff. Please arrange for your children to be wearing suitable swimming wear and have sun protection and a fresh pool towel. Please pick-up your children at the conclusion of the Waterpark session. A charge of NZ\$1 per minute applies for any late pick-up of children. Children aged to 11 years inclusive are welcome to join the Waterpark fun. Children staying in-house at The Rarotongan can use the Waterpark free of charge. For guests staying elsewhere on the island admission into the Waterpark is included in the NZ\$45 per child, per session admission into the Moko Kids Club and Teen Zone.

2.149. WATER

The Rarotongan and Sanctuary have in place a water filtration and UV-sterilization system which means your tap water has been through a comprehensive purification process. If you do however have any concerns you may prefer to boil your drinking water, or to buy bottled water from Captain Andy's Beach Bar, from the Raro Style Gift Shop, or from the Raro Style Gift Shop beside Reception at The Rarotongan 24/7. Please note that only bottled water is served in all our restaurants and bars for a small additional charge. While enjoying excursions away from the Resort and around the island you may wish to purchase bottled drinking water.

2.150. WATER SAFETY

Please note that there are no lifeguards on duty at Aroa Lagoonarium Marine Sanctuary or anywhere on Rarotonga. Therefore, we recommend the following water safety guidelines:

- always keep children within arm's length in or near the water
- check the water and weather conditions
- know your physical limits and experience
- never be in the water alone
- if in doubt, stay out of the water
- wear a buoyancy-vest or life jacket when kayaking or paddle boarding
- do not touch any marine life or coral
- always wear reef shoes
- if you need to stand up, wave your foot a few centimeters above the bottom to clear the area you will be standing on of any marine life
- use eco-friendly sunscreen or wear a T-Shirt or wet suit for sun protection
- do not enter the water after drinking alcohol
- if you need help, keep calm, and raise your hand in the air

The passages from the lagoon to the open ocean can be very dangerous. The nearest passage, to The Rarotongan and Sanctuary is Rutaki Passage and is over a kilometre to the east of the resort. Under no circumstances should you approach or enter the Rutaki Passage or any other passage in Rarotonga except with experienced guides on an organised and certified tour operator.

These passages can be dangerous for swimming, snorkelling, fishing, kayaking, and surfing, particularly for inexperienced or unfit swimmers. Several local fishermen and tourist snorkellers have drowned or been swept out to sea in these passages over the years. Do not at any time paddle out through (or over) the reef into the open ocean.

2.151. WEATHER

Unlike some nations closer to the Equator that have marked extremes in wet and dry seasons, **Rarotonga enjoys a pleasant climate year-round** with relatively minor fluctuations in temperature and climatic conditions.

June to September are our cooler months, whilst December through to March is our warmer season. As Rarotonga and Aitutaki are tropical islands in the heart of the South Pacific, passing warm tropical showers can be experienced at any time, without any specific pattern.

The term 'rainy season' is however a myth when it comes to the Cook Islands, as **there is no 'rainy season' here**. The warmer months tend to be slightly wetter (statistically speaking anyway), but if there is any rain it's – very conveniently – often at night!

The drier months from May/June to August/September range in maximum temperature from almost 25 to 26½ degrees Celsius. The warmer, more humid season from December to March (our Frangipani Season) enjoys a maximum temperature range of between 27 to 29 degrees Celsius. So even if there's a passing tropical shower, it's usually still warm and often sunny as well. It pays to remember that some of the most gorgeous blue-sky shots that you see in brochures were actually taken in January one of the absolutely best months to visit, often picture-perfect!

Travellers Tip! Don't get discouraged if you wake up and it looks like an overcast day; very likely it will have completely cleared by mid-morning. It's also wise though to 'make hay while the sun shines' as there are never any guarantees when it comes to the weather. In other words, don't wait until the last day of your trip to go on a special expedition, because Murphy's Law being what it is, it may well be raining on just that day. Tropical showers though are not uncommon but are usually warm and short-lived. Also, many people seem to think it's best to avoid the months from November through to April, yet these are by no means uncomfortably hot (after all, there's the air conditioning in your Resort room to retreat to if you feel the need for a refresher). By avoiding these months travellers miss out on some wonderful, seasonal aspects of life on Rarotonga such as fresh mangoes, pineapples, guavas, lychees and avocados, the vibrant spectacle of the bright red flamboyant (flame) trees in full flower lining the Main Circle Island Road (also known as Rarotonga's Christmas Tree), and haunting beauty and fragrant aroma of the white, yellow, pink, maroon and orange tipani (frangipani). Which is why we call it our **Frangipani Season**. Definitely not to be missed.

There are a number of easy walking and jogging routes directly accessible from the resort. You can walk or jog for miles along the beach in either direction. An inland walk will take you to the ancient "Ara Metua" which was originally built over a thousand years ago. Geological surveys have estimated that the location of the inland road was close to the shore line at the time it was built. As the building of roads was unknown in Polynesia at that time, some historians believe that this ancient road was built by the crew of a Spanish warship and / or their descendants ship wrecked from the Spanish fleet in South America. The atmosphere on the inland road, with scattered homesteads, farms, gardens, orchards, plantations etc., is very different from the main coastal road.

The Needle View & Secret Waterfall Hike


The volcanic plug "The Needle" is one of Rarotonga's most prominent land marks. The Cross Island Walk traverses the island and passes by the base of "The Needle". This hike will take you to a clearing in the rain forest that is directly opposite "The Needle" providing a great direct view of it. Take a walk along the beach and then through the taro swamps that have been cultivated for centuries and then up through the road to the Water Intake passing small farms and occasional homesteads until you get to the track off the road to the right which will take you up to the ridge line. You will find a track to the left to the Secret Waterfall. On your return trip you will travel on the ancient inland road the "Ara Metua" that was built over a thousand years ago and pass by farms, orchards and homes of the local people.






