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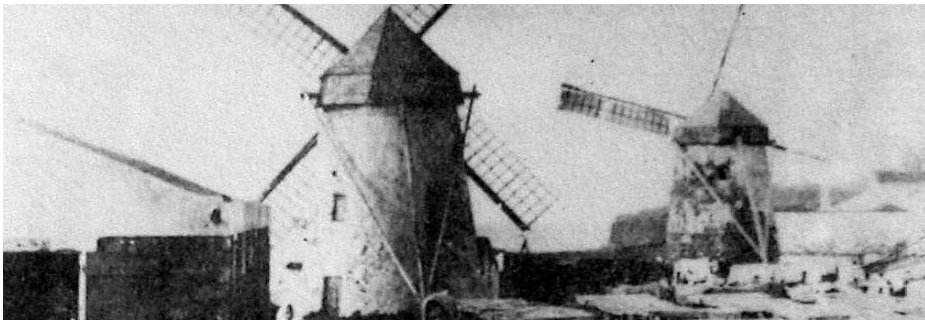

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WINDMILLS



Typical Windmill from São Miguel Island.

In Portugal mainland, windmills were started to be built at the beginning of the XIV century, but only centuries later have they appeared in the Azores. Historical records register the first ones to be built in São Miguel island in the beginning of the XIX century.

Our windmills follow the dutch architecture, as can be seen by our tower mills which are similar in shape to those found in Flandres (the region on the North of Belgium).

At one time, windmills were very popular in the Azores, for they required a privileged geographical location concerning wind directions to put their heavy machinery to work; no wonder you can spot them especially on the top of the hills, where the wind blows almost constantly.

Although these windmills were of great importance for household economies in the past when people would bring their cereals to make their flour, as time went by they were gradually replaced by mechanical machinery that would do the job effortlessly.

And so, windmills were abandoned in the landscape for decades as for people didn't see any further purpose on their infrastructures. Only more recently have some windmills been brought to life again either as museums or as cosy nests for tourists who couldn't love more of a stay in these beauties.



THE MILL

Moinho das Feteiras was built in the 19th century and was the support of surrounding population for wheat and cereals. With the constant development of the industrialization, it ended up being abandoned for a few decades until was acquired by the current owners in the 80s when it was in ruins. At this time, they started a research on the historical documents of São Miguel island, and it was possible to recover its original appearance, shape and dignity, bringing it back to its historical past.



MILLER'S HOUSE

The Miller was the person responsible for running Moinho das Feteiras and he lived very close to it. This house consisted in a single room with a dirt floor and a wood oven built under the large quarry and it was here that he ate and slept in his day-to-day life. Currently expanded and completely renovated, Casa do Moleiro is today a mix between the past and the present, where we can enjoy its ancient nobility and original features with contemporary comfort.

MÓ DE CIMA & CELEIRO

Mó de Cima and Celeiro are the old barns where cereals were kept before and after being ground. Built from old ruins from the 19th century, in these accommodations it is possible to enjoy a superb view over the windmill, the garden and the ocean, creating a memorable photographic clipping.

DO NOT MISS



SETECIDADES LAKE

One of the 7 Natural Wonders of Portugal, it showcases the Green and Blue Lakes, which according to legend, were formed from the tears of a shepherd and a princess who shared a forbidden love. These lakes can be seen from the King's View Lookout, named after King D. Carlos and Queen D. Amélia to celebrate their visit to the island in 1901.



PONTADA FERRARIA

Spa and bathing site with therapeutic water springs that have been used since the fifteenth century.



FOGO LAKE

A nature reserve since 1974, this crater lake reaches a maximum depth of 30 meters.



TERRA NOSTRA PARK

One of the most beautiful gardens in Europe, it features a thermal swimming pool and more than 2k different trees.



CALDEIRA VELHA

A waterfall of warm, iron water where you can take a dip, it is located on the north slope of the Fogo Volcano.



RIBEIRA QUENTE VILLAGE

A small fishing village with traditional fishing boats and a sheltered beach.



V. FRANCADO CAMPO ISLET

A nature reserve located approximately one km away from the coast, it features a salt water inside.



PINEAPPLE PLANTATIONS

The pineapple of São Miguel (Ananas Comosus L.) was originally introduced as an ornamental plant, with its industrial production only starting in the mid nineteenth century. It grows in glass, greenhouses, taking approximately two years to ripen and be ready to harvest.



FORTE DE SÃO BRÁS

This is the biggest fortress on the island and it protected it against the invasions of pirates and privateers. Presently, it is the headquarters of the Military Command of the Azores and it includes the Military Museum.



ROMANTIC GARDEN

Dating back to the nineteenth century, they include the António Borges Garden, named after the greatest Azorean landscape architect, and the José do Canto Garden, which has rare collections of plants.



PORTAS DA CIDADE

One of the most iconic monuments of Ponta Delgada, the Portas da Cidade (City Gates) were built in the eighteenth century next to the old quay and then transferred to the Gonçalo Velho Cabral Square during construction of the seaside Prince Henry Av. Composed of three arches, featuring in the middle the royal and the city's coat of arms. These gates are the city's postcard.



TEA PLANTATIONS

São Miguel is the only place in Europe where tea is produced. The first seeds (Camelia sinensis) arrived at the end of the 19th century, along with experts who came to teach the various phases of production. The different varieties of tea depend upon the maturity of the leaves used and upon the manufacturing process.



SÃO SEBASTIÃO CHURCH

Designed mainly according to the Late Gothic style, the main facade of Manueline style stands out for the royal coat of arms and the shield with the arrows of the martyrdom of St. Sebastian. It was later changed in the eighteenth century. On the south facade, there are two busts identified as King John III and Queen Catherine of Austria.
