



Bored cell phone is a photography platform on Facebook created by a young architect called Fikreselassie Tsegaye (Shady Deeds) back in August 2018. It's basically a cell phone photography group which works as a laboratory for young amateur photographers and artists. Facebook itself has made the platform as one of the top five sub-Saharan groups under the title - Icons of change.

Bored cell phone Addis Ababa as an initiative; is a "let's take a step back!" process. A step back for the sake of the future two steps ahead. Questioning the very basic requirements of photography.

'Why a studio?, why a professional camera? Why being too busy about it?' at least as starters, as an initiation. "You could be bored, you can use your cell phone and your studio can go as wild and as open as a city. ... They don't get even a chance to try something, which they may make themselves believe they can achieve it. Therefore, Bored cell phone Addis Ababa only took a step back, didn't contact photographers or those with a studio, Just only cared to build a community, individuals who feels the same and been doing it on their own; and give them a platform to express themselves with no boundary. Even if you have a camera, put it down use your phone kind of argument was placed. And as we saw it we have more people everyday who share and accept our platform and grow with it. After some workshops and practice we believe we have awesome people and good photographers who can feed the art industry. RUN AFRICA

Run Africa's Athletics Club goes hand in hand with the company's tourism activities, enabling clients to train with professional athletes and, thereby, to discover the continent's vibrant running culture. The athletes from the club have been trained to share their lifestyle of Ethiopian athletics with visitors from abroad, the forest paths and meadows, the training routines, the drills and stretches which have produced generations of Olympic champions.

Rekik Bekele, Managing Director of Run Africa, is a keen fun runner and founder of two Ethiopian companies.

'I realized some years ago that the rapid growth of global running culture was piquing visitors' interest in Ethiopia's running culture, but that there was no existing forum for connecting athletics with tourism. Addis is very rich in knowledgeable, experienced runners who struggle to succeed but who should be able to earn income from sharing their experience. We registered Run Africa in 2015, driven by that vision to avail Ethiopian athletes' talent, expertise and discipline to every level of fitness enthusiast.

SOCIAL CONTRIBUTION

Run Africa's athletes train hard every day to compete in national and international races. However, only a few of them will make it to the top.

Most elite Ethiopian athletes hail from humble rural backgrounds. Most drop out of school in their early teens in order to move to the city and pursue athletics, often with few (if any) urban connections and thus no support network. Even fulfilling basic sporting needs are a huge challenge for them. On top of this, many women athletes come to depend on men for day-to-day bread winning and house rent. Indeed, even if they do meet all or most of these needs, the vast majority of athletes who do not make it to the lucrative international racing circuit must eventually fall back on low-skilled, low-paying jobs. Most athletes dropped out of school at early age to pursue a career in running.

Run Africa addresses as many of these problems as possible by combining its day-to-day business –personalised athletics training, hiking and tourism packages – with professional and personal skills development for the members of its athletics club, Run Africa AC. In addition to promoting their success in races, the club also creates a supportive, close-knit community for the athletes which is also a platform from which to diversify and broaden their personal and professional skills. As Rekik explains,

TRAIN YOUR WAY!

The running sessions offered by Run Africa range from completely customized individual sessions to group runs.

The one-to-one training increases strength, stamina and running skills at altitude, as guided by the athlete trainer.

Run Africa Weekend (RAW) programmes offer more sociable, weekend morning sessions, typically comprising jogging at a gentle pace for 45 to 60 minutes. Participants meet others while discovering new routes, landscapes and the running lore of Addis Ababa.

Hiking and teambuilding

For those less keen on running who still long for a taste of the Ethiopian outdoors, Run Africa's hiking excursions allow clients to experience the beauty of the landscapes where the athletes train in the hills and forests of the highlands, both close to Addis Ababa city centre and further afield.

Companies and organizations that looking for a fun, challenging teambuilding experience for their staff group can also rely on Run Africa to deliver. Group hiking and team games are tailored to suit the group, and provide the perfect fun and bonding alternative to the work floor. Past clients include Diageo, Reach for Change and John Snow International. Said one satisfied participant from the Meta Beer Factory,

EVENTS

The largest and, arguably, the most exciting running event in Africa is the Great Ethiopian Run. This mass event, held every year in November, sees 45,000 revellers enjoy the heart of Addis Ababa along 10km roads closed to traffic. Run Africa offers designated training in preparation for this event, enabling adaptation to the altitude and as well as the full Ethiopian athletics

experience culture and visits to museums, restaurants and even a traditional coffee ceremony hosted in the home of an athlete member of Run Africa AC.

TEAM

Run Africa AC is managed by Negash Habte, who was 10,000m junior world-record holder for four years, World Junior Cross Country silver medallist in 1985 and Ethiopian National Team Coach in 2001-2008. Negash has coached many of the biggest names in distance running and, most recently, is credited with bringing out 10,000m world record holder and Olympic gold medallist Almaz Ayana. He leads Run Africa AC training sessions three times a week.

The Marketing and Operations department forms a mixed team of Ethiopian and overseas team members, bringing a diversity of experience and interests.

Together with the team of athlete guides, Run Africa works hard every day to bring the world of athletics and tourism together so that visitors to Ethiopia get an opportunity to immerse themselves in the vibrant culture of athletics here, while the athletes gain skills and experience in sports tourism and other key areas.



ountry split by the Great Rift Valley. With archaeological finds dating back more than 3 milllion years, it's a place of ancient culture. Among its important sites are Lalibela with its rock-cut Christian churches from the 12th–13th centuries. Aksum is the ruins of an ancient city with obelisks, tombs, castles and Our Lady Mary of Zion church and there are also so much more old cultural destinations and holidays among them, Timket "ተምቀት" Ethiopian Epiphany is one of the oldest and colourful festival/celebration that the country hold and keeps it for centuries.

'ጥምትት', 'Timket' Ethiopian Epiphany is the greatest festival of the Ethiopian year, falling just 2 weeks after Ethiopian Christmas. Ethiopian Epiphany (Timket) has several colourful stories. This annual religious celebration of Ethiopian Orthodox Church is not just another event for the believers to be thankful and get more blessing. From the very beginning, the celebration has unique and very attractive way of festivity. Though its primary implication is religious, it is an event people from different spiritual background enjoy and celebrate equally. Timket celebrates the baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist in Jordan River. To memorize this biblical chronicle, the Tabots of each church (a replica of the Arc of the covenant) repres-

enting all the saints will be out of their secret holy houses (Bete Mekdes), and make a slow procession to the nearest river. There are about 44 saints celebrated by Ethiopian Orthodox Churches, and each one of them has their own replica of the Arc of Covenant. Under the dogma of the church, the Tabots have extreme relevance than the building of the church. Watching the Tabots out of their Bete Mekdes, where only few have an access, and see them on the streets is one of the most valuable religious moments for the believers. Many follow the Tabots from the church to their respective destination. In Addis Ababa, most Tabots end up at Jan-Meda, a big space around Sidest Kilo.

The Tabots start their journey on January 19/20, in the afternoon. This day is called Ketera, which is the beginning of the almost three days of colourful Timket celebration. Once the Tabots reach their destination, most followers do not go home. Instead, they spend the night praying, singing and dancing. The event is one of the biggest public festivals where everyone from different ages and social group takes equal participation. Especially traditional dances and songs of all kinds and the modern Harmonica music with dance are at the top of the all-night party.



The next day, the prayers in one side and the dance and music on the other will continue. The mass takes place in the morning and the religious fathers pray on the water to make it a holy water and sprinkle it on the believers. Everyone will fight to touch the water and share the blessing. Religious leaders speak the words of god. Finally, when its time, those engaged on the prayers and others busy using the event as a party will follow the Tabot to its respective churches. People will go in a direction where the Tabot is to their nearest church.


For many, what makes Timket very attractive is its religious ceremony that is calm, with beautifully arranged prayer melody (Kidase). Colourful costumes of the religious leaders, priests, and everyone engaged in the making of the ceremony, the shine and impressive umbrellas to protect the leaders and the Tabot from the sun and the classical gowns makes the ceremony the most beautiful celebration of all time. The slow movement of the Tabot, that is covered with incredibly designed wrap, and the respect and gratitude it gets in its entire journey also make any stranger choose not to be anywhere but there.

Young and Passionate members of church sing, with their special costumes mostly with traditional tunes, delight the whole journey of the Tabot, with original Orthodox Church musical instruments like Tsenasel. To give their sound novel and conventional tune they use the traditional Ethiopian drum (Kebro), with incredibly big size. From January 19-20, for two days, they follow the Tabot all the way with their sound. On Temiket, everything looks and smells very original, unique and beautifully traditional, making the event one of the few occasions to have an insight of the real Ethiopia, which is rich in culture and tradition.

Most Tabots will be back to their churches holy house by the evening of January 20. Except those who decide to follow the Saint Michael Tabot, everyone says good-bye and go home praying to be there at the same time and at the same place next year to follow the Tabots. Saint Michael remains to be the only one to go home on January 21 because it has its own monthly celebration on the same day. That makes, in some areas, Temiket a three-day celebration.

In addition to the direct participants of the celebration, watching the followers of Tabot is another unique experience. Everyone takes considerable care to choose his or her outfit for Temket. It is a rare opportunity for many to use the beautiful and attractive traditional cloths. There is even a saving that underlines the importance of dressing well for Temket. 'Letemket yalehone kemis yebetatese,' or meaning 'a dress if not for Temiket has no use.' This is because the remarkable and colourful celebration of Timket especially in the past, in addition to its religious significance, is an occasion where young people choose their future wives and husbands. It is an opportunity to meet and engage with stranger opposite sex without adult supervision. The parents understood this trend and let their mostly teen-age children to be free and engage in the music and dancing without restrictions. Though it does not happen in our modern day, stories have it that the boy will throw a lemon on a girl he wishes to dance with to let her know he is interested. If she feels the same, then they will get down with traditional Eskesta until they get tired. The talk will take place after that.

Timket was celebrated last week with its colourful glory and traditional essence. However, young people did not throw lemon at each other. They joke about lemon getting very expensive, but the real reason behind is the fact that they can just get a phone number of a girl or a boy they are interested in.


A fast-growing economy is bringing sustainable tourism — and an expanded airport — to the Ethiopian capital

When Glacier National Park was created in 1910, there were 150 glaciers; today, only 25 still exist. As harsh winters and scorching summers continue to change the landscape of the park, it still offers jaw-dropping natural beauty, with 762 lakes, 175 mountains, 200-plus waterfalls and more than 700 miles of trails. And this summer will see the reopening of the Sperry Chalet, a beloved century-old wilderness lodge that's been rebuilt after a destructive wildfire in 2017. To enjoy the nearly \$9 million reconstruction of the 17-room dormitory, be prepared to make a reservation months in advance and then plan for a rugged hike up the side of a mountain to get there. While the chalet and other historic lodges are great base camps, those wanting to stay closer to civilization should head to Whitefish, an old railroad stop turned resort town, about 30 minutes west. Award-winning restaurants like Cafe Kandahar and boutique lodgings such as the Firebrand Hotel have opened in recent years, but this lakeside town still maintains its frontier spirit.

In Ethiopia, horses have been a part of the traditional culture for hundreds of years in daily life and cultural celebrations such as weddings and religious celebrations, where horses are adorned with decorative tack and ridden in local parades. There is also a long tradition of sport competition of jumping and racing horses in Ethiopia. During the reign of Emperor Halie Sellasie, the racing club at JanMeda and Balderas were home to weekly competitions for all ages.

In the heart of the city, the Ethiopian equine tradition continues for all riding enthusiasts at Addis Ababa Equestrian Society (AAES) stables.


Located in Old Airport near Mekanisa Abo Church, AAES stable houses 20 horses and two riding arenas. AAES stables offers a family oriented environment in Addis Ababa for adults and children who want to learn how to ride horses and for experienced riders who want to continue to enjoy the sport. There are experienced trainers who utilize a series of lessons to teach basics to advanced English riding skills, jumping and dressage. Trail rides outside the stable are also offered for experienced riders. Young children can take pony rides and birthday party options are available.

For those who ride frequently, AAES offers memberships for reduced riding rates and horse ownership. AAES promotes English style riding and jumping with a rustic twist. Come experience it for yourself!











Gomen be'Siga

Gomen is a popular vegetarian dish, mostly just collard green fried up with some butter. It's really good as a vegetarian dish, but even better when it's mixed with some extra garlic, diced pieces of beef, and some extra vegetables, known as gomen be siga – and it's no longer vegetarian.

It's not always served in a hot clay vessel, but it sometimes is, and it was really delicious the time I got it. You can either spoon out scoops of collard greens and beef onto a piece of injera, or you can dig right into the bowl.



Tella

Tella is a traditional beer from Ethiopia. It is brewed from various grains, typically Teff and Sorghum. Depending on region, barley, wheat, or maize may be used; spices can also be added. Dried and ground shiny-leaf buckthorn leaves are used for fermentation. Due to the addition of bread and use of a fermentation vessel which has been smoked over dried olive wood or Abyssinian rose wood, Tella may have a smoky flavour. The alcohol content of unfiltered Tella is usually around 2–4 Volume percent, filtered tella contains about 5–6 vol%.

Tella is often home-brewed. It may be offered in Tella houses (tellabet), usually in regular homes, where people meet and talk to each other.

Tella was commonly used for kiddush by the Beta Israel (Ethiopian Jews). Tella was used because wine was often unavailable.

Derek Tibs

Despite there being plenty of vegetarian food available in Ethiopia, if you're a meat lover, many Ethiopians are also in love with meat. Walking along the streets of Addis Ababa, you'll get whiffs of freshly butchered meat, hanging in the open air butchery ready to be sliced off and served by the chunk.

Step into a butcher and you can order a straight up hunk of raw beef served with a dipping sauce, but I especially liked roasted meat, known as derek tibs. You can normally choose between beef or goat, and the meat is sliced up into pieces, fried with butter, and served inside a flaming hot ceramic dish.#



INGREDIENTS

- · Raisin 60g
- Rum 40g
- · Orange and lemon zest 50g
- Flour 410g
- · Milk powder 30g
- · Salt 8g
- Warm milk 60ml
- Yeast 12g
- Water 35ml
- Full egg 2 pcs
- Sugar 150g
- Butter soft 75g

DIRECTION

- 1. Raisin and rum mix and cover for 6 hours
- 2. Flour, milk powder, salt, egg, yeast, water, warm milk, sugar, orange, lemon zest all number two items mix to gether for 10 min
- 3. This items cover and keep for 10 min
- 4. After 10 min put the butter and mix for 5 min
- 5. Put all number one ingredients with the dough and mix together






